


<u>1967</u> Garden City vision introduced




#### <u>1973</u> Garden City Action Committee







## **Cooled Conservatories: Gardens under Glass**



- Display plants from Mediterranean-type and semi-arid climatic regions of the world
- 1.2 hectares of column-free space, with a height of 45 metres
- Temperature: 18°C 23°C, humidity: 60% 80%

**Cooled Conservatories: Flower Dome** 



- Display plants from Tropical Montane regions between 1,000 3,500m above sea level
- 0.8 hectare of space, with a height of 65 metres
- 35-metre tall mountain with waterfall
- Temperature: 23°C 25°C, humidity: 80% 90%

**Cooled Conservatories: Cloud Forest** 



- 18 Supertrees ranging from 25 50 metres in height
- Provide scale and dimension to the Gardens, while marrying form and function of mature trees
- 128-metre long aerial walkway
- Bistro-bar on 50-metre tall Supertree






