Vulnerable groups and people with disabilities in Zagreb have repeatedly expressed interest to participate in urban gardening projects, which led to the creation of a therapeutic garden in the city. The garden was designed with the aim of strengthening the motor, sensory, cognitive and social functions of its users and providing a space that improves well-being by providing accessible and serene spaces for socialisation and contemplation.



The eThekwini Municipality initiated the Fire and Invasive Species Control (FISC) Programme in 2009, with the intention of controlling invasive alien plants on important biodiversity sites around the Municipality. The programme aims to ensure optimal restoration of critical biodiversity sites, while at the same time delivering green job creation and skills development through employment and training of local people.






